	Super Magnum Coil Teeth Larger diameter tooth for longer wear in big weed situations and hard or abrasive soil. Moves more soil so follow-up with Reverse Magnum Teeth may be necessary. Counter-clockwise rotation.	Spring and early growing season
	Sweeper/Tiller Teeth Maintain weed-free rows after breakout or soil conditioning to stay ahead of regrowth. Get weeds before they reach six inches in height. Use along fences, feedlots, and building foundations.	Mid-season  Post harvest  Fall cleanup and sanitation
	Brush Rake Teeth Rake brush 42 inches out of the row after pruning. Rotate slowly counter-clockwise to walk the teeth along the row, windrowing the prunings toward middle.	Winter and early spring cleanup
	Brush Rake/Sweeper Tiller Combo Rotate counter-clockwise at higher speed for fast shallow cultivation. Get weeds before they reach six inches in height. Preserve firm turf before nut harvest. Sweeping/raking action is great for post harvest cleanup and sanitation.	Mid to late season Preharvest Post-harvest Fall cleanup and sanitation
